




Prep Stay & Play - Building a Positive Start to School

Transitions are crucial for a smooth start to school, helping children adjust to new environments, routines, and expectations. By gradually introducing them to the school setting, transitions reduce anxiety and build confidence, making children feel more secure and ready to learn. These early experiences also help establish a sense of routine and familiarity, which are key to a successful and positive start in their educational journey.

Our Prep "Stay and Play" sessions are a valuable part of this transition, helping our future students become familiar with the classroom and its routines before the school year officially begins. These sessions allow children to explore their new learning environment, meet their teachers, and engage with future classmates in a relaxed, play-based setting. By participating in activities that mirror the school day, children gain a sense of what to expect, easing worries and building confidence.

Over the past three weeks, our future Preps have begun their CSS journey through our Stay and Play sessions. It has been wonderful to see so many happy faces, engaged in play and forming friendships with their soon-to-be classmates. Through these sessions, students had the opportunity to spend time in classrooms, get to know their school and teachers, and begin building strong connections with Caravonica and their new friends.

Positive Classroom Environments

Our school-wide expectations are what teachers use to develop a set of classroom rules with their students in relation to behavioural and academic expectations. Although the language and phrasing of these rules will vary according to each classroom, each set of 3-5 rules will be consistent with the values expressed by the school-wide expectations.

Teachers and staff use their classroom rules in conjunction with explicitly teaching and reinforcing the weekly PBL behaviour focus to support student behaviour.


