From our Principal

Last week we hosted 2 successful events at Caravonica – Pirate Day and our annual Colour Run. Our student leaders raised \$410.20 for research into Childhood Brain Cancer on Dress Like a Pirate Day on Wednesday. Then on Friday, with the help of a large group of parent volunteers, our students participated in our Colour Run – with the overall aim of raising money to spend on class activities and resources. We are looking forward to hearing how each classes fundraising efforts went and seeing what items are purchased for use by the students this year. My thanks to Mrs Jenkins and Ms Rooke for co-ordinating this event alongside the many volunteers and staff members who helped out before, during and after school. The photos that have been shared with me show what a wonderful time our students had!

We believe the well-being of our students is very important. We understand that, in order for our students to thrive academically, they must also feel safe and supported. With this in mind, we have several practices to prioritise overall well-being, including:

1. Providing a Safe And Nurturing Environment: Our school strives to create a safe, inclusive and welcoming environment for all students. We promote kindness, respect and empathy, and want every child to feel valued, included and accepted. We have clear behaviour expectations and anti-bullying policies in place to maintain a positive and supportive school environment;

2. Social-Emotional Learning [including TRP]: We recognise the importance of developing our students social and emotional skills. Through this intentional teaching we help our students to understand and manage their emotions, build healthy relationships, and develop optimism, persistence and resilience.

3. Additional Supports: We have a team available to support student well-being when we become concerned. Parents and carers are a valued part of this support process. This team provides a safe space for students to express themselves and then address concerns and build skills. This wrap around approach provides short term supports – should students require longer term support the school team will help support families to link in with outside agencies.

4. Parent and Community Involvement: We firmly believe that fostering a strong partnership with parents and the wider community is necessary for supporting student well-being. We encourage communication, provide workshops on relevant topics [such as the online workshop offered last week on TRP], and involve families in school activities and decision making [e.g. P&C].

We understand that each child is unique and that some require more individualised supports. If you have any concerns regarding your child's well-being please don't hesitate to reach out to their class teacher. We are here to listen, collaborate and ensure every child is thriving and reaching their potential at school.

Respectful Relationships Education

We are excited to introduce Respectful Relationships Education to our teaching and learning schedule at Caravonica State School. This departmental initiative teaches students how to develop behaviours and attitudes that promote healthy, safe and respectful relationships. Everyone has the right to be respected, feel valued and be treated equally. We all have a role to play in fostering respect.

The program is aligned with the Australian Curriculum and provides teachers with age-appropriate teaching and learning resources to support students.

In week 9 and 10 of each term, teachers will implement this program throughout classrooms. Key teaching this term will focus on Personal and Social Awareness. This will include:

Prep:

- describing emotions
- using appropriate language to make connections between feelings
- body reactions and body language

Year 1 – 2:

- using senses to recognise safe and unsafe situations;
- making connection between sensory information and emotions;
- role-playing how to respond to safe and unsafe situations

Year 3-4:

- concepts such as assigned sex, gender and gender stereotypes
- how aspects of culture, history and social expectations influence choices and behaviours of genders

Year 5-6:

• how people, popular culture and the media influence their developing identities What role can I play?

By having regular conversations about what positive, happy and equal relationships look like, you can help your child build self-respect and learn to be respectful to others. These conversations will assist in building your child's social-emotional skills.
