From our Principal

STUDENT DRESS CODE

It is an expectation of the Caravonica School Community that all students abide by the School Dress Code of our school. It is a long-held belief of our school that this code helps develop a sense of identity for our students. The school is also a workplace [for staff and students] and as such WHS requirements must also be met.

We have noticed some confusion among students regarding the distinction between our everyday dress code and our sports day dress code. This week we are re-teaching this expectation with students so I thought it was opportune to reinforce the student dress code with families.

General Uniform Requirements

- Red Caravonica school polo shirt available through the Uniform Shop
- · Black shorts/skort/skirt mid-thigh length; long tights
- Black broad brim hat available through the Uniform Shop

Please note: Short beach length shorts are inappropriate for school wear at any time, bike pants/skins can only be worn for athletics carnivals; longer length tights acceptable). Skins and 'active wear shorts or bike pants' are practical for sports days but are not a part of our daily uniform.

Y6 Students can wear the seniors polo available through the Uniform Shop.

The rule 'NO HAT, NO SHOES, NO PLAY' means that children must wear footwear and broad brim hats during break times. For health and safety reasons, students should wear fully enclosed shoes or sandals instead of thongs. Crocs are not acceptable as they do not provide adequate support and students cannot run safely in them.

Free Dress Days

On free dress days, students may wear non-uniform items, provided:

- 1. The clothing is sun-safe shoulders and upper arms are covered by clothing just like our school uniform;
- 2. Shirts free of obscene language and symbols;
- 3. The length of shorts/ skirt/ dress is at least the equivalent of the regular uniform i.e. at least mid-thigh;
- 4. A hat (not cap) that affords the same amount of sun protection as the uniform hat.

Sports Day Dress

On school inter-house sports days, students may wear non-uniform items. Please note:

- 1. The house-coloured shirts red, blue or green with sleeves (and a collar where possible);
- 2. The wearing of bike pants/skins is acceptable on this day;
- 3. Hair can be temporarily coloured in house colours on this day.

If there are challenges for your family in adhering to our dress code please contact the office. This way we can address your concerns/challenges and find a way for all students to meet the requirements of our dress code



An instructional approach to behaviour

Taking an instructional approach to behaviour means that we place importance on explicitly teaching students how to meet the behavioural expectations. Behaviour is taught in exactly the same way as academics, using direct instruction, modelling and guided practice. When students fail to meet expectations, we treat this as a behavioural error and provide additional prompts and re-teaching. As educators, we have a duty to teach students the skills they will need to have fulfilling lives and to contribute towards society.

MEDICAL CONDITIONS

It is essential to ensure that the school is informed of all medical conditions on enrolment [heart conditions, epilepsy or any other serious disability that could impact your child's wellbeing].

This information will be updated on your child's enrolment profile as soon as information is supplied to the school.

Students diagnosed with anaphylaxis, asthma, epilepsy and/or any other diagnosed condition requiring support must have an Action Plan that clearly outlines steps to follow. Action Plans are designed with student, parent and doctor consultation. It is the parent's responsibility to ensure the school has a copy of the current Action Plan.

Correct emergency contact details MUST BE KEPT UP TO DATE AT ALL TIMES.

MEDICATION

Medication must be brought to the front office by an adult.

Parent's will then be requested to sign and date a permission form, allowing school staff to administer the medication on their behalf.

Medication will only be administered to students when it has been prescribed by a doctor and is in the original pharmacy dispensed container and is clearly labelled with the:

- 1. Student's name
- 2. Medication name
- 3. Dosage
- 4. Time/s for administering the Medication
- 5. Doctor's name

Non-prescribed, over-thecounter medication will not be administered.
