Newsletter

Welcome back to term 2 at Caravonica. I hope that you and your family were able to find time to rest and be together over the 2-week break. I am so glad that we are all back together as your child/ren are so important to us!

This term we have a full calendar of events beginning with our Anzac Day Commemorative Assembly on Thursday 24 April at 9.15am [in our school hall]. This is a whole of school assembly and parents/carers are welcome to attend. This term our Y6s are off to Tinaroo Environmental Education Centre for camp and our Y5s have their trip to Holloways Beach Environmental Education Centre. There will also be our annual Mother's Day stall, a student leader fundraiser, our Under 8s morning and report cards to end the term. It is going to be a wonderful term of learning at Caravonica.

We have started this term with some general reteaching around uniform expectations. Just like many workplaces our students have a specific uniform. It is an expectation that all students abide by this policy as our uniform helps develop a sense of identity and pride for our students. The school is also a workplace [for staff and students] and as such WHS requirements must also be met. General Uniform Requirements:

- Red Caravonica school polo shirt available though the Uniform Shop
- Black shorts/skort/skirt mid-thigh length; long tights (shorts and skorts are available through our Uniform Shop)
- Black broad brim hat available through the Uniform Shop

Please note: Short beach length shorts are inappropriate for school wear at any time, bike pants/skins can only be worn for athletics carnivals; longer length tights acceptable)

The rule 'NO HAT, NO SHOES, NO PLAY' means that children must wear footwear and broad brim hats. Crocs are not acceptable as they do not provide adequate support and students cannot run safely in them.

Hair accessories are to be minimal. Hair should be worn clean and neatly groomed. Shoulder length or longer hair is to be tied back, and hair kept out of eyes. Hair tones are to be one natural shade.

Due to WH&S concerns, jewellery is to be limited to one watch or bracelet or bangle, one small discreet necklace worn inside the school shirt; small sleepers or studs only (earrings). Fully enclosed shoes or sandals must be worn for health and safety purposes. Thongs and crocs are not acceptable in this workplace. The wearing of make-up is not appropriate for school.

Students who participate in Choir, Concert Band and String Orchestra require a performance uniform.

On free dress days, students may wear non-uniform items, provided:

- 1. The clothing is sun-safe just like our school uniform;
- 2. Shirts free of obscene language and symbols;
- 3. The length of shorts/ skirt/ dress is at least the equivalent of the regular uniform i.e. at least mid-thigh:
- 4. A hat (not cap) that affords the same amount of sun protection as the uniform hat.

On school inter-house sports days, students may wear non-uniform items. Please note:

- 1. The house-coloured shirts red, blue or green with sleeves (and a collar where possible);
- 2. The wearing of bike pants/skins is acceptable on this day;
- 3. Hair can be temporarily coloured in house colours on this day.

Regular school attendance is essential for every student's success, both academically and socially. When students attend school consistently, they build strong learning habits, develop meaningful friendships, and stay connected to school routines, which boosts their confidence and achievement. Positive attendance sets students up for lifelong success by ensuring they don't miss out on important lessons, discussions, and collaborative activities that support their growth. On the other hand, frequent absences can make it difficult for students to keep up with their learning, cause gaps in knowledge, and lead to feelings of disconnection from peers and teachers. These challenges can impact not only academic performance but also emotional wellbeing and long-term engagement with education.

At Caravonica State School, we understand that sometimes families face genuine barriers to regular attendance, and we are here to support you. Our team works closely with families to understand individual circumstances and can offer assistance such as connection to wellbeing services, and support plans to help students return to school successfully. If your child is unwell or unable to attend school, we encourage families to communicate with us by replying to text messages sent from the school, calling the office directly, emailing either the class teacher or the office, or by registering the absence through the Q Parents app. Keeping the school informed helps us to ensure your child's wellbeing and maintain accurate attendance records.

The Caravonica Way

At Caravonica, our school values — **Caring, Safe, and Successful** — shape who we are and how we learn together. These values create the foundation for a strong, supportive, and positive school community where every student and staff member can thrive both academically and socially.

Being Caring, Safe, and Successful is more than just words — it's the way we work, play, and support each other every day.

At Caravonica, students show this by:

- Being organised and allowing others to learn.
- Speaking with kindness and respect.
- Being in the right place at the right time.
- Arriving prepared, staying with their class, and always trying their best.

PBL at Caravonica Explicitly Teaching Positive Behaviour

A key part of our whole-school behaviour approach is the **explicit teaching** of expected behaviours. We don't assume students know what positive behaviour looks and sounds like — we teach it clearly and consistently.

Each week, we highlight a specific behaviour focus — from routines and social skills to reducing bullying and promoting emotional wellbeing.

The process includes:

- A weekly introduction of the focus at Parade.
- Daily teaching and reinforcement in classrooms and playgrounds.
- Family communication through newsletters and school signage, so expectations are clear and consistent both at school and at home.

When we consistently model and reinforce these behaviours, we build a school where every child feels **Caring, Safe, and Successful** — every day.
