From our Principal

At Caravonica State School, we are committed to creating a positive and supportive school environment for all students. The philosophy that underpins our commitment is Positive Behaviour for Learning, or PBL. PBL is a whole-school framework for behaviour support adopted by many Queensland schools. We believe that by promoting positive behaviour, we can enhance learning outcomes and well-being for everyone in our school community.

So, what exactly is PBL?

PBL is about teaching positive behaviour and creating a school-wide environment that supports and reinforces these behaviours. It is based on the idea that all children can learn positive behaviour, just as they learn other subjects like math or science. By teaching and reinforcing positive behaviour, we can create a school culture where everyone feels safe, respected, and valued.

What are the benefits of using the PBL framework?

PBL helps schools to be consistent in the way they support and respond to behaviour. PBL enables our school to develop clear expectations and boundaries for behaviour and ensures that behaviour support is differentiated according to need. PBL has a strong research base and has been shown to improve student outcomes, increase staff and student wellbeing, and reduce behavioural incidents. PBL helps us to select evidence-based practices which have been shown to improve student behaviour and establish a safe and supportive learning environment.

At Caravonica, we implement PBL through a variety of strategies:

Clear Expectations: We have clearly defined expectations for behaviour in different settings across the school, such as in the classroom, playground, and assembly areas. These expectations are taught to students and are consistently reinforced.

Recognition and Rewards: We recognize and celebrate students who demonstrate positive behaviour. This can include verbal praise, certificates, or other acknowledgements that reinforce their positive behaviour.

Support for Students: For students who may find these expectations difficult, we provide additional support and guidance. This might include individualized behaviour plans, counselling, or other interventions to help them learn and demonstrate positive behaviour.

Consistent Approach: PBL is a whole-school approach, meaning that all staff members are committed to promoting positive behaviour and using consistent strategies across the school.

Why is PBL important?

PBL is important because it creates a positive and inclusive school culture where everyone can thrive. When students feel safe, respected, and supported, they are more engaged in learning and are better able to reach their full potential. PBL also helps to minimise disruptive behaviour, improve student-teacher relationships, and create a sense of belonging for all students.

PBL Weekly Focus

Week 3

Following Instructions

Following instructions is a part of everyday life. It is the child's ability to act on requests by others. It is important for children to be able to follow instructions so that they can function effectively across different environments (e.g. home, kindergarten/school, when at the park or visiting a friend's house). If a child struggles with following instructions this impacts on their ability to reach the desired 'purpose' or 'outcome' and thus complete tasks effectively. At Caravonica, students demonstrate this when they:

- · follow the instructions of all adults in all situations,
- use equipment and resources for their intended purpose,
- · follow the routines and expectations of our school.

PBL at Caravonica

Universal Supports - Tier 1

Universal support is the foundation for PBL. The focus is on establishing a whole-school planned approach to wellbeing and strengthening the school learning culture.

Key features of universal support include:

- · clear, shared expectations for behaviour that are explicitly taught for different school settings
- consistent positive feedback
- a range of strategies to respond to students who are not following the school's expectations
- · continuous collection and use of data for decision making

Crucially all school staff provide universal support for all students across all settings including classrooms and non-classroom areas such as corridors, canteen, oval, school gates and buses
